From protecting our countryside to helping our towns thrive; from making sure everybody can lead fulfilling lives to ensuring everybody can share in the borough's prosperity; the vision sets out our communities' ambitions for the future.

Communities Vision 2035 will be used by partners to guide their actions, whilst working with communities to foster commitment from local people.

Working together is the only way we will deliver on our ambition to make Wokingham Borough a place where everyone has a chance to succeed, where nobody gets left behind and where everybody has a voice.

Capturing the voices of our communities

The Communities Vision steering group was formed in the spring of 2023 by 18 partner organisations. All partners actively work in local communities across the borough, so they were able to gather views from a much wider number of people, beyond just an online survey. Twelve months on, enough feedback was gathered then analysed to create the 6 ambitions within this vision. Some of the quotes from the community have been included to reflect the future everyone wants to see.

What we mean by partners:

Representatives from business, education, faith groups, Wokingham Youth Council, health and voluntary sectors as well as the borough council form a steering group to guide the creation of the Vision 2035.

We would welcome other organisations who share the aspirations it sets out to join the Vision 2035 and become partners in achieving them.

Therefore, when this document refers to 'partners' it means those organisations that contributed to its creation but also those organisations willing to adopt it as a guide to their activities.

What we mean by everybody:

Everybody means just that - everybody, not just certain groups like adults. We want to be absolutley clear on that. But often it is read to just mean something else - just means adults or some other group. So, we want to be absolutely clear that, when this vision refers to 'everybody' or 'all of us' it includes you if you live, work or study in the borough.



Community voices Hopes and ambitions for the borough

There are things we love about our borough now. There is a strong sense of community and an enjoyment of our green spaces and countryside. There is an appreciation that the towns and villages that make up the borough have their own distinct character and attractions.

Many of us value the convenience, comfort and quality of life here. Our economic strength, transport connections, schools, safety, public services and facilities make this an attractive place for a lot of people.


But life here is experienced in different ways and we do not all fairly share the benefits the borough brings. While this is largely a safe and friendly place, some of us don't always feel secure, welcomed and valued for who we are. This is a borough of huge opportunities for many, but not all of us can take advantage of these at present. And while we rightly celebrate our community spirit, we know some are not made to feel they belong and cannot contribute as they would like.

Change has been a constant theme in our conversations. We worry it will mean losing the things we value but at the same time look forward to the opportunities it creates. Change brings challenges and opportunities, and we are aware that our response to these will define the borough's success in the future. Our conversations have highlighted challenges - we worry that housing growth will destroy our green spaces, but we fear being a place young people cannot afford a home. We want to protect our environment but are unsure of the sacrifices that will require.

We are deeply concerned about congestion but uncertain of how to reduce it with our current lifestyles.

We know that our success is based on economic strength but hate that prosperity is not shared fairly.

We cherish our young people and are determined to see them succeed and yet, they worry about fitting in, affording homes, finding good things to do and staying safe. These conversations with people have led to 6 ambitions for the borough:



Ambition for the future 1: Protecting and improving our places

We care about the environment and want to protect it. We love the green spaces and enjoy spending time in the countryside as well as our town and village centres. As a community we take pride in what it looks like and want high standards maintained.

But we are worried about the changes needed to reduce carbon emissions, loss of green space, unequal access to nature and potential threats to its clean and tidy appearance.

What we want the borough to be:

- Somewhere that looks and feels loved with clean, green and well-kept spaces for everybody to enjoy
- > A place that is protected for future generations

What we want to happen:

- Protect our environment by reducing pollution and carbon emissions and learn to live with climate change
- Make sure everybody can easily access and enjoy green spaces
- > Support our town and village centres to thrive
- Maintain and celebrate our built and natural heritage
- Keep our public and private spaces clean and tidy

- Consider how to reduce the environmental impact of all our decision and actions
- > Support sustainable ways of working and living
- Protect heritage and green spaces within our power to do so
- Improve our towns and villages for all, in ways that are sympathetic to their past

- Make changes (small or large) to our lives that reduce our impact on the environment
- > Show pride in the area by keeping it clean and tidy
- Use and respect our green spaces to have fun and improve our health and well-being
- Use our town and village centres for shopping, socialising and for the services they provide

Ambition for the future 2: Making it easy for people to access the things they want and need

There are great facilities, things to do and services across the borough but not everybody can get to them easily or even at all. Some people struggle to live the lives they want. We are frustrated that it's not always as easy getting around the borough as we would like, with congestion seen as an increasing problem and not all things or services accessible to all. Options such as public transport or cycling are not always sufficient.

What we want the borough to be:

- Somewhere where the businesses, services and facilities people need are easily in their reach
- A place with no barriers that prevent people from living fulfilled lives

- Better public transport options and healthy ways to get around to reduce congestion
- Everyone can access facilities and things to do where and when they need them



- Champion accessibility for all in our decisions and actions
- Make sure the things we provide are accessible and available to everybody
- Promote and provide ways of travelling that reduce congestion
- Use and develop technology, including digital, to make life easier for everybody

- > Support equal access to all services for all people
- Willingly and supportively share spaces and places with everybody
- > Use alternatives to the car when practical
- Be open to using new technology and modernised ways of getting goods and services

Ambition for the future 3: Building and maintaining great communities

Community spirit is strong here. We have passionate charities and volunteers dedicated to making life better. This is a place most people find safe, welcoming and friendly. However, we want to strive for inclusion for all and places where everyone feels they belong. We must also make it easy and fulfilling to give our time to help others.

What we want the borough to be:

- Somewhere everybody feels they belong and knows they are valued, with opportunities for all to contribute to local life in their own way
- A place of kindness and safety where differences are celebrated and people can be themselves without fear, discrimination or prejudice
 - "Be a place where the people of the community work together for the common good, helping themselves to enjoy better more meaningful lives by sharing skills, knowledge, insights and their time"

- Make it easy and rewarding for everybody to volunteer in the community
- > Work together to keep everybody safe
- Treat everybody with respect and dignity as individuals

- Be welcoming, understanding and friendly to everybody
- > Help people and make life better for others
- Help prevent crime, including by calling out and reporting hatred and discrimination
- > Respect each other's differences and choices

Ambition for the future 4: Providing fair opportunities for everyone



The towns and villages of Wokingham are places of opportunity. Our schools are good and many of our young people are successful in a variety of ways. We must work together to maintain high standards and ensure they are shared by all. This is a great place to live with good facilities and local events that bring people together. It is also an expensive place to live with some people unable to afford its benefits and a concern about the future generations' ability to find a home here.

What we want the borough to be:

- Somewhere everybody can fulfil their potential, with excellent, equal chances to make a home and thrive in education, work, sport and leisure
- A place with plenty of things for everybody to do, where events and activities are accessible for everyone

There is economic strength in our borough. We are home to many businesses and a university of outstanding innovation. But we must adapt to a changing world and the needs of our communities. We will strive to make sure economic success is open to all and that nobody is left out.

What we want the borough to be:

- A place where opportunity is growing and is being shared fairly for everybody's benefit
